Provide a narrative for how you plan to monitor and measure your project's success.

We will utilize surveys and assessment of practical application of the knowledge to monitor and measure the project's success. We will obtain baseline data during day 1 of the Youth Empowerment Camp through a pre-assessment survey that will ask multiple choice and open-ended questions related to the information being taught in the program including life skills, financial planning and reproductive health. In addition the survey will ask the individual to rate his/herself in terms of ability, comfort and attitudes toward public speaking, groupwork, goal setting and each individual's future plans. During the Youth Empowerment Camp, we will monitor the success through the practical application of newly learned material. For example, after the career panel and goal setting sessions, the individuals will be required to create their own five and ten year plans for the future. Following the exercise, each person will present their plans to the group. During the presentation, Courtney Ruble can both measure the individual's knowledge level and also their effectiveness as a presenter. Criteria will include but is not limited to: clarity, body language, voice level, audience engagement, length of presentation, quality of content and visual aids. During the final day of the Camp, a post-assessment survey will be conducted with the same questions as the pre-assessment. Interviews will also be collected at the end of the Youth Empowerment Camp to aid in assessing the individual's level of comfort and attitudes toward public speaking and also allow for the individual to share information and experiences not included within the pre and post-assessment surveys. The interviews will also provide feedback regarding the individual's overall experience and provide data and specifics to improve the organization and execution for the upcoming years.
