Fundraising Ideas

After students have picked a project to learn about and support and have requested the complete application, host a fundraiser! Designing fundraisers requires students to think creatively and practically; structuring them instills responsibility and hones organizational and leadership skills.

Movie Night

- ✓ Host a movie night at your school or a communal space. Show a movie or documentary related to your project; either about your specific country or a particular issue your project is focused on
- ✓ Charge a fee (suggestion \$5-\$10)
- ✓ Sell candy, food, and drink!

Spare Change

- ✓ Decorate a bucket and put it in your classroom, announce your project to the class and distribute a flyer describing the project (you can also make it a competition between classes or grades!)
- ✓ Encourage classmates to collect and donate spare change—it will add up!

Host a Raffle:

- ✓ Student leaders identify and ask local businesses to donate items to be raffled
- ✓ Raffle tickets are sold at a campus-wide event or throughout the year to family and friends

Bake Sale:

- ✓ Bake homemade treats or ask a local bakery to sell the club food at a discounted price
- ✓ Hold a themed bake sale (Valentine's Day, St. Patrick's Day, Halloween, etc.)
- ✓ Sell the food afterschool, at a sports event, or a performance

Host a walk-a-thon, dance-a-thon, anything-a-thon!

- ✓ Collect commitments from family and friends per lap/mile/minute and participate together in a fun campus-wide event!

Out of Uniform Day:

- ✓ Does your school require a uniform? Host an out of uniform day! Have people pay to wear dress down clothes on a particular day (Suggestion: \$2-\$7)
- ✓ Make sure you educate everyone who participates on the project!
