#### **NATIONAL COORDINATOR'S 2016 REPORT**

It is always with a mixed feeling that I sit down to write the introduction to our Maiden Annual Report. As the National Coordinator, it falls to me to sum up the year. In doing so, I alternate between pride and disappointment, between hope and despair.

With pride I can say that our intervention and actions are having an impact to the population we serve. Our activities are increasing; we are adapting to a rapidly changing situations. During the year 2016 we expanded our work and campaign strategies to match the changes we see in the communities we serve.

Looking at the achievement the organization made in the year 2016 and putting this into context, our job and mission to rid the streets of poor and vulnerable children by reintegrating them back to their respective families and communities becomes increasingly demanding by state actors including the beneficiaries themselves.
